

**NON-DEPENDANT DEDUCTIONS FROM  
HOUSING BENEFIT AND COUNCIL TAX SUPPORT  
2024/2025**

A non-dependant is someone who usually lives with you but not on a commercial basis, for example, adult sons or daughters, other relatives or friends.

We normally have to deduct an amount from your Housing and/or Council Tax Support if you have non-dependants living in your household. If this is the case, the amount of the deduction will be shown on the benefit notification. You should check the deduction against the table over the page and if you think it is wrong, you must contact us.

**If you (or your partner) are aged 65 or over**, we will not make a deduction until 26 weeks after a non-dependant joins your household. Also, if we need to increase the deduction after a change in the non-dependant's circumstances, we will not do this until 26 weeks after the change.

**If you (or your partner) are registered blind or receiving Attendance Allowance or the care component of Disability Living Allowance** we will not make a deduction for non-dependants.

**If you have rent-free weeks**, we have to adjust the Non-Dependant deduction amount to take this into account. **If you rent your home from Chorley Community Housing** and so pay rent for 49 weeks instead of 53 (2024/25), the adjusted amount is shown in the table over the page.

**How much is the deduction?**

The amount of the deduction depends on the non-dependant's income (and their partner if they have one).

We only make one deduction for a couple. If the circumstances of each member of the couple would lead to two different deductions, the highest one is made.

If either or both members of the couple are working for 16 hours or more per week, the total income of both members of the couple are added together to work out the deduction that applies.
